

# Then & Now Photo Packet

1. Built in 1919, this building was used for Vaudeville Shows first, followed by movies and high school graduations before closing and converting into a warehouse in 1981. It was restored in 1995, and to this day it houses a modern theatre, arts gallery, and classrooms.



2. Built by Gustav Stickley between 1908 and 1917 this building is emblematic of the "Craftsman" style home. Originally intended to be a farm school for boys, the house now serves a different purpose and offers specialized tours. Was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1989.

3. Built in 1827 on the site of its original log predecessor, this building has served as the center of the Morris County seat since. Renovated and expanded numerous times, beginning in the late 19th century, it was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1977.



4. This building was built in 1911 by the Delaware, Lackawanna and Western Railroad Company to replace the original 1882 structure while its town continued to grow as a resort community. Currently owned by a Foundation which shares the name of the township its services. The structure was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 2016.

5. This Street was originally constructed in 1836, soon after the borough it is within changed its name from Bottle Hill to its current designation. This road is one of the five roads around this borough's Main Street that comprises its Civic Commercial District.

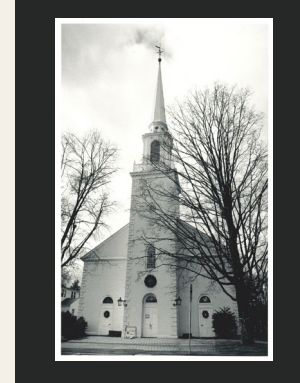
6. This Avenue evolved from a 19th-century residential area into a vibrant, commercial corridor starting in the 1870s. [blank] Avenue Extension business district included these pictured trolley tracks laid in 1909, whose station still stands at the south corner of Jaqui Avenue.



7. Built in 1758 by English Quaker colonists, who purchased the land from Robert Schooley to use as a cemetery. It served as the center of religious and social life for a Quaker community for over a century. It has been owned, operated, maintained, and refurbished by an independent preservation organization, since 1898.



8. Built in 1771 to replace the original congregational structure from 1736, all but the walls of this building were destroyed in a fire in 1937. The current structure was rebuilt from those ashes in 1939.



9. Built in 1848 by John Ralston Nesbitt, this building operated until 1904 and is connected to the Burnett Brook. It was then purchased by Thomas J. Loughlin in 1905 and converted into a distillery. Later it was sold to Sam Fornaro Sr. because of usage restrictions under prohibition. Today it is deeded to the Township it resides within.



10. The view of this road looking away from downtown Morris Plains, includes an overpass built in 1915 with a crossing steam engine. This is a vital transportation corridor in a region with history dating back to the late 1500s. It serves as a major connector for the town's annual Memorial Day parade.
